



# Kindergarten Exit Skills

## Bible Study

- Knows that Jesus loves us and died on the cross for us
- Recognizes sin and the consequences of sin in daily life
- Understands that through grace, sins are forgiven
- Knows selected Old and New Testament Stories
- Shows a growing love of Jesus through worship and praise
- Demonstrates a desire to share Jesus' love with others
- Memorizes simple Bible verses

## Language Arts

- Identifies all capital and lower case letters of the alphabet
- Identifies all letter sounds
- Identifies opposites
- Identifies and produces rhyming words
- Recognizes environmental print
- Participates in group reading activities and makes predictions
- Identifies the parts of a book
- Identifies the characters, setting, and main details of a story
- Retells familiar stories
- Demonstrates concepts of print
- Reads common high frequency words
- Segments sounds in a word
- Blends sounds into words
- Identifies a letter, word, and sentence
- Identifies ending punctuation (? . !)
- Reads emergent reader texts

## Writing

- Communicates in picture form
- Dictates ideas/experiences
- Writes using developmental spelling
- Writes first and last name using capital and lower case letters
- Writes capital and lower case letters

## General Skills

- Identifies basic computer terms
- Knows address and phone number
- Knows birthday
- Ties shoes
- Plays, cooperates, and gets along with others
- Follows school/class rules
- Cares for property and materials
- Stays on task and follows directions

## Math

- Demonstrates 1 to 1 correspondence
- Counts up to 100 objects
- Counts by 1's, 5's, 10's to 100
- Reads numerals 1-31
- Writes the numerals 1-31 in order
- Compares non-equivalent sets (more and less)
- Identifies and constructs patterns
- Solves simple addition and subtraction problems with objects and drawings within 10
- Recognizes basic shapes
- Classifies objects by size, shape, and color
- Compares the length and weight of different objects
- Tells time to the hour

## Science

- Begins to observe, compare, sort, and sequence
- Identifies and describes 5 senses
- Identifies and uses science tools
- Describes the characteristics of living and nonliving things
- Compares animals by shape, size, and body coverings.
- Identifies needs/lifecycle of plants and animals
- Identifies the parts of a plant
- Describes different environments where plants and animals live
- Identifies and describes weather conditions
- Understands the properties of liquids and solids
- Understands that sound, light, and heat are kinds of energy
- Observes and describes how things move

## Social Studies

- Understands the concept of fairness and respect for the rights and opinions of others
- Understands the purpose of rules in the classroom and school
- Identifies the role of leaders in the home, school, and community
- Identifies American Symbols and monuments
- Identifies basic human needs
- Identifies the difference between needs and wants
- Describes different kinds of jobs that people do
- Understands that maps and globes are simple representations of places on Earth
- Understands the world is made up of landforms and bodies of water
